The Unifying Value of Sport

The most important event of 2023 was undoubtedly the Pan-American Congress organized in early October by Panathlon's Ecuador District and Club Guayaquil.

The highlights of the Congress are outlined here in our Magazine. Much appreciated was the attendance of many Europeans amongst the Latin American panathletes. This contributed to the latter having a better understanding of the geopolitical realities of this immense continent, which is in turn of great benefit to the universality of our Movement.

Panathlon's spirit and the dissemination of Olympic values is a reality experienced daily amongst the panathletes of the 9 Latin American countries where the Panathlon International is present. And, our agreement with ODEBO, a sports organization present in 7 countries of South America, should ensure a greater visibility of our Organization.



The cherry on the cake: shortly after the conclusion of the Congress we received news of the creation of a Club in Colombia and therefore the welcome membership of a new country into the Panathletic family.

The appeal of the Congress has therefore borne fruit in terms of its expansion of Panathlon International – it was definitely worth it!

The recent SportAccord Forum, which took place in mid-November in Lausanne, at the Olympic Museum, dealt with a much different subject and atmosphere for the world of international sport.

SportAccord is a global sports association and federative organization based in the Olympic capital, Lausanne, Switzerland; it is comprised of the leading "umbrella" sports organizations including international Olympic and non-Olympic federations.

Panathlon International, as a IOC recognized body, is invited to events organized by SportAccord, in particular, the Annual Forum where the main topical issues in the world of sport are discussed.

Times are hard for the whole of the Olympic Movement.

Addressed mainly to the International Sports Federations, but also to members of the Olympic Family, IOC President, Thomas Bach, gave a very powerful speech. Here are some of the essential parts: "Current geopolitical tensions are extremely complex. In these difficult times, the unifying power of sport is more important than ever. (...) Our role is clear: to unite people - and not to aggravate division".

The IOC President described the growing danger to the entire sports movement of seeing its unifying mission weakened, "not to mention being attacked, by one government or another. Some would like to decide which athletes participate in which competitions. Others would like to decide where competitions will be held. Others still insist on organizing their sporting events within a political perspective. In the latter case, above all, this would mean that a government would take control of international sport. If so, your role and that of the Olympic Movement would become obsolete".

He added: "In such a politicised sports world, (...) competitions would only take place between politically similar blocks and it would be impossible for sport to present a unifying force for the whole of society and humanity". The scenario is bleak, yet realistic. During the Round Table held in Rome last year, Panathlon International provided its own reflections in the context of Russia's war against Ukraine. President Bach is right to draw the entire Olympic Movement's attention to the existence of these real and persistent threats.

Nevertheless, Panathlon International and all its clubs - aware of these dangers and above all concerned about the dissemination of Olympic values - will prevail in finding the necessary motivation to pursue their mission.

Panathlon International at the 15th Pan American Congress in Guayaquil -"El deporte es más que ganar o perder" 2-7 Octobre 2023

For the first time in many years, the 'headquarters' of Panathlon International moved to Ecuador to attend the 15th Pan American Congress and at the same time organise two institutional meetings: the International Council and the District Presidents' Committee.

After making several economic estimates, and thanks to the hospitality of the Panathlon Club of Guayaquil, it was assessed that the minimal difference between the costs of organising in Europe or South America was largely compensated for by the opportunity to strengthen the links between the two continents and to increase the development of IP in Latin America thanks to the participation of an important European delegation. We can say that the objectives were achieved!

All participants were able to appreciate the hospitality of District President Danilo Carrera Drouet and President of the Club of Guayaquil César Pólit, as well as to deepen their mutual knowledge in an atmosphere of friendship and shared panathletic values.

International board and signing of a MoU with ODEBO

Upon the arrival of the international board members on 2 October at the Oro Verde Hotel, a ceremony took place to sign the collaboration agreement with ODEBO, the South American organisation for the Bolivarian Games. With this agreement, which is the first in South America, a new project of participation of South American clubs in the Bolivarian Games, which take place in seven South American countries, and the awarding of a Fair Play prize is born. ODEBO President Balthazar Medina - Colombian - and President Pierre Zappelli in the presence of the International Board signed this important collaboration agreement.

In the evening, the delegates present were invited by the President of the District of Ecuador Danilo Carrera and Guayaquil Club President Caesar Polit to a cocktail party that took place on the terrace of the



Guayaquil bench with a view of the extensive city that lies on the junction of several rivers.

The following day, 3 October, a meeting of the International Board took place with Past President Giacomo Santini, Treasurer Stefano Giulieri and Board of Auditors member Marino Albani.

Among the various items on the agenda, there was a discussion on the Savings Commission and the hypothesis of finding resources. The International Board then gladly approved the constitution of the new Argentina District and approved the document, prepared by the working group, for the establishment of a PI ethics commission and a code of ethics to be approved at the General Assembly in Agrigento. It also noted with pleasure the continuation of the Erasmus Sport Against Match Fixing (SAMF) project and the appointment of three PI ambassadors to disseminate the results of this project.

The institutional meetings continue on 4 October with the District Presidents' Committee where the topics discussed will be taken up again.

At the end of the proceedings, the International Board was received by the governor of the province of Guayas, Francesco Tabacchi, and then attended the inauguration of the glories of Ecuadorian sport.

District Presidents' Committee

The PI institutional meetings continued: on 4 October, the District Presidents' Committee meeting was held at the Bankers Club.

All district presidents or delegates were present, with only District President Austria Joseph Muller and Treasurer Stefano Giulieri remotely connected.

The meeting was opened by International President Pierre Zappelli who, after thanking Ecuador District President Luis Danilo Carrera for the organisation and welcome, congratulated him on the large attendance and participation and explained the IB's decision to set up the Ethics Commission for the adoption of a code of ethics to be approved at the General Assembly.

He then passed the floor to Secretary General Simona Callo for an update on the activities of the General Secretariat, who welcomed the new President of the Argentine District Jorge Minuto. Then IB member Luis Moreno took the floor to explain the development of the Plan de Desarollo, followed by Treasurer Stefano Giulieri to discuss the organisation of the District Presidents Committee meetings with a view to saving management and finding resources.

The District Presidents, after a summary discussion of all the activity reports, drew up a final document that was submitted to the international board that joined the committee and is published separately.



CONCLUSIONS OF THE 15th PAN-AMERICAN CONGRESS

- The presence of International President Pierre Zappelli, members of the International Board and representatives of the Districts of America and Europe is motivating and fruitful for the participants of the 15th Pan-American Congress.
- The agreement with the Bolivarian Sports Organisation (ODEBO), signed within the Congress, is a historical milestone in our events and at the same time determines a first step towards a greater presence of the International Panathletic Movement in the world.
- The central theme of the 15th Pan-American Congress of the International Panathletic Movement, 'SPORT IS MORE THAN WINNING OR LOSING', will allow our panathletes and participants to broaden their vision especially on the aspects of sport, health, inclusion and education, facing the future with commitment and continuing to contribute, with our ideas, to the good of the PI.
- We recommend that the PI Cultural Scientific Commission study the possibility that the agreements reached at the upcoming Pan-American Congresses will serve as input for its future commitments and to address the challenges that humanity will encounter in the coming decades.
- We are grateful for the support of the Clubs in participating in this continental event, especially in comparison to previous congresses.
- We thank the District of Ecuador and the Club of Guayaquil for having organised this PanAmerican Congress and for the splendid welcome to all participants. All this confirms the presence and expansion of the Panathletic movement in America

District Presidents' Committee Guayaquil ECU - 4th October 2023 Final Document

The District Presidents' Committee meeting ended at 4 p.m. and highlighted the following points:

1. Special recognition was given by the Committee to the efforts and work deployed by President Pierre Zappelli and the International Board, during their respective terms of office, to promote the international operations of our movement.

The District Presidents wish to:

- 2. Praise the work accomplished by our Clubs after the pandemic; as a matter of fact, the Clubs were successful in exceeding the pre-Covid level of activity and in increasing their operations and actions for the benefit of sport and Fair Play.
- 3. Encourage both District Presidents and Governors to visit the Clubs whenever necessary and in accordance with Panathlon International's standard rules.
- 4. Stress the need for District Presidents to hold both online and in-person meetings, scheduling at least one in-person meeting and one online meeting every year.
- 5. Thank for and praise the excellent work accomplished in connection with the "plan de desarrollo" which was drafted and approved by the International Board.
- 6. Agree and highlight in every possible forum that there is a need to promote the cultural values of sport and the sustainability of our movement.
- 7. In view of further expansion and of establishing new Clubs, ask the International Board to consider whether it would be feasible to reduce the number of members initially required to initiate the process for setting up a new Club.
- 8. Obtain the engagement of an extended number of athletes to promote Pl's values in all sports, including the sports for the disabled.
- 9. Develop the broadest possible range of activities to celebrate Panathlon Day and World Fair Play Day in all our Clubs

Argentina District founded Ethics Commission launched

During their last meeting, on 3rd October, within the framework of the Guayaquil Congress, the International Council adopted several resolutions. Alongside administrative issues there were two matters, which are surely of interest to all members: the establishment of the District Argentina and the launch of the Ethics Commission.

DISTRICT ARGENTINA: in consideration of attaining the necessary minimum number of clubs (three), Argentina returns to again having its own District. The text of the resolution reads as follows:

"Having taken note of the resolution 31/23/CP, IC also incorporated positive opinions with the resolution - to ratify the constitution of District ARGENTINA will already be represented within the Committee of Presidents of the Districts, scheduled the following day, by President Jorge Alberto Minuto."

ETHICS COMMISSION: The subject has been under discussion for some time, and, after a wide range of opinions and proposals, the following resolution has been reached:

"The CI, having taken note of Resolution 31/23/CP, also took note of the following: - attached document drawn up by the President following the Commission meetings held on 16 March and 29 August 2023 - the request to approve proposals contained therein, considering the positive opinion of those present, decides to approve the proposals, namely, to:

- 1. agree to adopt the IOC-based Code of Ethics, in so far as their provisions will apply to Panathlon International, in particular, clauses A (Fundamental Principles), B (Integrity of Conduct), D (Good Governance and Resources) and G (Obligation to inform). Pursuant to Article 3.1 of the Universal Principles, the Code of Ethics must be approved by the "highest governing body", which for PI is the General Assembly,
- 2. appoint an Ethics Commission, which will have rules, but which will have a responsibility to ensure all individual members, clubs and PI bodies comply with PI's Code of Ethics provisions,
- 3. which will be consulted on the basis of an alert or complaint by any PI member or body, or by any person whether or not connected with to PI, and on their own initiative, and which will report to the IC for subsequent action

- to continue the initiatives to ensure PI can be considered by the IOC as a "model association" for its distinction.

- to instruct the Secretary General to collect by e-mail names of candidates that will comprise the committee, so that they can be constituted at the next General Assembly scheduled for 14th June 2024 in Agrigento.



Postions of service not positions of power

Here we are once again: in six months, Panathlon International returns to the assembly to elect its next international leaders as well as celebrating the traditional cultural and scientific congress, this time, dedicated to the inclusion and enhancement of women in sport.

The event returns to Sicily, for the first time since the Syracuse 2012 meeting during which I had the honour of being elected International President. This coincidence has given me hindsight and allowed me to better reflect on and assess my four years as president and the 8 years past-presidency as both member of the International Council and member of the Presidency Committee, together with the Vice-President and of course President and with voting rights in both branches of the organisation.

The first reflection regards the statutory amendment approved by IC that lays out a much lighter role for the next past president, semi-official so to speak, this is because their participation in the International Council and Presidency Committee is dependent on invitation and even then does not carry voting rights. The role of third full CDP member will be held by an international advisor who will support the Vice-President and President. The secretary general and the treasurer of course will continue to operate within the PC.

There are no foreseeable critical repercussions regarding this statutory change as the role of next past president will be up to the current President Pierre Zappelli when he proposed it had the aim of increasingly aligning Panathlon's functional modalities with the those of the IOC.

Another statutory amendment approved during the last four years, regards the restoration of re-electability for Panathlon offices, which was fiercely contested in 2012 in Syracuse when it was decided, with an almost plebiscitary vote, the four-year limit would be unsurpassable and unrepeatable.

Restoring re-electability heavily affects the "election campaign" of those who intend to put themselves forward as a new international advisor and, perhaps, as the next president.

Beyond the legitimate ambitions of individuals, I beliveve I contribute to

the serenity of the choice remembering that being a Panathlon leader does not mean occupying a "seat of power" but rather exercising a "role of service".

It is also appropriate that all those who have "aspirations" for this high office should know it's not to be taken lightly or to fit in with one's spare time. This is because it requires the person to be available everyday on the phone not to mention frequent trips to Rapallo as well as to other panathletic locations from major world congresses to a presence at convivial clubs on the occasion of special events.

Ergo: is a role for a pensioner willing to travel, with good legs and a strong stomach, and who is able to cope with the pace of socialising, willing to relearn many things one believed they already knew and to accept that despite their commitment there will always be a member, club, area or district more inclined to criticism than praise. Finally, considering how Panathlon has spread accross the world, it is not a bad idea to have a command of one or two languages.

Less demanding is the role of International Adviser who, however, still must be ready to undertake trips for IC meetings, perform representative tasks as well as taking a seat at the table in order to be updated on international activities and individual clubs or districts.

Finally, one must forget nationality because you can only be of use to the IC team if you remember: you are above all, panathletes and defenders of ethical and moral values as well as bearers of ideals and being open to dialogue.



IOC suspends Russia for attack on Ukraine

The unilateral decision taken by the Russian Olympic Committee on 5 October 2023 to include, as its members, the regional sports organisations which are under the authority of the National Olympic Committee (NOC) of Ukraine (namely Donetsk, Kherson, Luhansk and Zaporizhzhia) constitutes a breach of the Olympic Charter because it violates the territorial integrity of the NOC of Ukraine, as recognised by the International Olympic Committee (IOC) in accordance with the Olympic Charter.

In view of the above, the IOC Executive Board (EB) today decided that:

- 1. The Russian Olympic Committee is suspended with immediate effect until further notice.
- 2. The suspension has the following consequences:
- a. The Russian Olympic Committee is no longer entitled to operate as a National Olympic Committee, as defined in the Olympic Charter, and cannot receive any funding from the Olympic Movement.
- b. As stated in the IOC's *position and recommendations of 28 March 2023*, which remain fully in place, the IOC reserves the right to decide about the participation of individual neutral athletes with a Russian passport in the Olympic Games Paris 2024 and the Olympic Winter Games Milano Cortina 2026 at the appropriate time.

The IOC EB also reserves the right to take any further decision or measure depending on the development of this situation.



Winter Olympics and Paralympics illustrated in Italian schools

Several races will also be disputed in Trentino Alto Adige

A week of teaching sports and Olympic and Paralympic events in Italian schools.

Winter Games Week is the initiative promoted by the Ministry of Education and Merit - General Management for students, inclusion and educational guidance - together with Milan Cortina 2026 Foundation raising awareness amongst young people on the Olympic and Paralympic issues during the pathway that will lead Italy to hosting the 2026 Winter Games.

An initiative of national scope targeted at pupils and students who will still be at school in 2026, and will be able to observe, if not indeed participate in, the Winter Olympics and Paralympics with a greater awareness of sports, cultural and respect for citizenship values not to mention sustainability and cohesion linked to the anticipated Olympic and Paralympic events.

There will be a program of educational initiatives and teaching materials that will be made available to teachers promoting sports, physical activity among young people as well as the dissemination of Olympic and Paralympic values among students and students.



Erasmus Project SAMF third meeting in Lithuania

Before young people we educate parents and teachers

Starting with schools may help, but the ground must be prepared

Fair Play is a positive concept - it is a way of thinking and a fundamental principle of living sport.

60 years since Jean Presset drew up the Fair Play Charter - 60 years that we have been trying to re-establish and rediscover Fair Play.

The fair play movement is an intentional gesture that generates motion, gives rise to sport and therefore demands a source. The source over time must express itself in terms of "smart motion" (i.e. intelligent activity). It's obvious that any movement that will develop in sport or "smart motion" requires energy.

The "source" that allows the practice of sport is the vitality that must have and take inspiration from an energy source.

But what is the individual force that pushes from the depths to take hold and provide that energy?

There are several hypotheses:

- Freud believed the energy that "transforms" into movement and sport is "sex drive", understood as the pursuit of pleasure in a broad sense, and that this often works in pairs with an aggressive drive.
- Jung, a student of Freud, argued it is not possible to define energy that drives an individual to act, nor that it is a sexual drive. He just called it "Life Energy".
- Another Freud disciple, Alfred Adler, believed human behaviour is greatly influenced by the social conditions in which one lives and therefore Energy consists of the quest to overcome a personal "feeling of inferiority".
- Another student of Freud, Karen Horney, disagrees with 'drives' theories and finds instead that Energy is born from a search for security that allows one to overcome "the basic Anguish".
- For Erich Fromm, energy comes from a desire to react to the isolation and insecurity that characterize Society.

All these hypotheses - sexual and aggressive drives,



vital energy, overcoming feelings of inferiority or basic anguish - have a common denominator: without exception, they are present from the early years of life in all children.

Mental development scholars agree that early life experiences are critical to personality development:

- a) The positive, intense and continuous emotional bond with an adult is a prerequisite for a healthy foundation of emotional and social development.
- b) It starts with a smile from a human face, from anguish to the sight of a stranger's face and then you come to the affirmation of your own convictions, to contrasting with an adult to affirm your opinion by delivering the first NO.
- c) This is the perfect time for children to acquire a fundamental moral concept. Initially, morality is based on adult authority. Later, it evolves into morality not based on adult authority, but on the group to which that individual is a member.

The first stage of the educational process takes place in family with social, moral and emotional education as well as the perception of security.

In a second phase, the school comes into play with intellectual development and a definitive integration into social life.

Education assumes and includes co-existence, collaboration and the integration of different leading

figures into one's life.

The concept of education should be interpreted as a "family of concepts". The subject acquires the full characteristics of his own species incorporating at least four moments: biological growth, inculturation, learning and training.

- 1 Biological Growth regards the development of an organism and its potential.
- 2 Inculturation is a socializing process through the setting of examples, habits with the assimilation of behaviours, beliefs, life practices and prejudices.
- 3 Learning takes place through the assimilation of knowledge, techniques, specific languages and codes.
- 4 Training is the end point of inculturation and learning it is the organic and functional synthesis of knowledge and techniques as well as a free assimilation of the culture in which one lives.

Many, far too many, parents have not been able to teach and instil a sense of danger, ethics and morals in the minds of young people - often young people find themselves disconnected from reality.

Parents who in the face of tragedies exclaim "everything works out, just offer the right amount" Parents who allow young people to stay glued to their screens or monitors up to 8 hours a day, otherwise "I won't be able to get anything done" No? - otherwise "at the restaurant you won't be able to eat in peace" No?

Parents who, even though unaware of the metaverse (virtual space in which the differences with reality become almost imperceptible) allow their children to live their lives in that metaverse considering the two lives as overlapping one another. They consider the same thing. "Live" and live in the metaverse.

We live in a fake democratic and respectable society, which has abdicated the figures and roles of educator, parent and teacher in favour of "influencers". It follows that for these parents to talk about ethics and values in sport can often sound old-fashioned, because strength for them means an awareness that these are empty words and concepts, frivolous, void of their original meaning.

For 60 years we have been offering Fair Play exclusively to children, to young people who are getting into sports.

We did not realize that "cultural transmission" is incomplete and interrupted.

To avoid always having to start from scratch, we

should instead try to educate Parents who perhaps need it even more than their children.

Let us teach Parents the Olympic values. Values of sport which, as we know, always put the universal principles of the person first.

Let us explain to Parents that affection - as a set of feelings, emotions and passion - is the basis for human communication; and its development or lack of is an essential determining factor that leads to wellbeing or conversely their psychological maladjustment.

Let us offer Parents a chance to reacquaint themselves with the concept of education as a "family of concepts" - the family of the **7** Cs.

Let us propose they should relate to young people by complying with:

Capacity - Character - Cohesion - Competence - Community - Courage - Creativity

Capacity skills in different situations with an aptitude for problem solving.

Character in addition to biologically determined characteristics, derives from the way in which relationship experiences are integrated and the emotional components are linked to values chosen in relation to the role and cultural system in which we live.

Cohesion solidarity of intent and ideas - a mutual attraction. Do not forget that the diatribe is always disintegrating.

Competence the necessary preparation to practise certain activities and make judgments.

Community the presence of shared values, commitment and a social programme.

Courage, strength in facing up to difficult situations or dangers - it entails assuming both physical and moral responsibility.

Creativity ability and facility to create with ingenuity and imagination. The creative process starts from motivation, a need for autonomy, the desire to explore the environment and ourselves, an impulse to overcome what is organized, packaged, pre-constituted and then go beyond.

The value of little examples

While meetings take place with great world bodies who inspire and support fair play, one does wonder, at a grassroots level, what can really be done to make the idea of respect take a hold in the brains and hearts of young people.

Panathlon has promoted vigorous action towards primary and secondary schools where values and feelings are injected into a field still yet to be reclaimed and thus ready to absorb fresh energy.

Every year, most clubs identify and award the various cases of fair play: ranging from the truly striking to those which acknowledge the careers of ath-

letes and executives which represent in themselves exemplary stories.



However, the defect of these initiatives is their temporary nature: there is a certain fanfare at the time of the ceremonies and then you must wait for the following year before you can talk about it again.

The strategy that should instead be supported is a 'fair play' penny applied to every local football match or peripheral manifestation for any discipline. It is not necessary to wait for the next high-profile situation that often never arrives - it should instead be the preference to be on the lookout for the thousands of small but just as significant cases occurring at each sporting event even those which are the most modest.

One of these exemplary cases was witnessed on an Italian football pitch during a match between cadet teams between 10 to 13 years old.

During one passage of play, a footballer unceremoniously "hacked down" an opponent sending him to the ground with a bruised shin - an unpleasant and yet highly common situation during a football match. The reaction of the injured player on the other hand was stunning: he chased after the offender, pushed them over before throwing him to the ground where he kicked him.

The referee intervened by sanctioning him with a yellow card and warning him not to repeat the offence. For him that was about the level of severity the young footballer's behaviour justified. There was no, however, no reflective thinking on the negative consequences of that gesture on sporting ethics.

The aggressive player's coach, however, was not of the same opinion. At the first interruption of the game he called the young man to the bench replacing him with another player - for that coach, this situation had a much deeper meaning in an educational sense.

In fact, after the match, he took the young player by the arm and led him towards the opponent who had fouled him and then suffered his violent reaction. The move did not go unnoticed by all the spectators who followed the action of the coach with great interest.

Without ostentation or duress, he suggested his student should apologize to the opponent and for both of them to close the matter with a handshake.

The tone, the words, the atmosphere of silence and expectation from the onlooking spectators took care of the rest emphasising what was an unexpected and yet compelling example.


The two young people, in fact, obviously impressed by their lesson in fair play, ended up hugging each other.

As part of the European Week of Sport, Panathlon International EU Brussels organized an event in collaboration with ENGSO Youth on 26 September 203.



Mr Matteo Zacchetti, deputy head of the European Commission Directory General Education, Culture and Sport Unit opened the session and highlighted the importance of the European Week of Sport as a booster in the promotion of a healthy lifestyle and the importance of an active live and the role of Sport in the development of social cohesion.

The EC Directory welcomes the partnership with Panathlon and ENGSO in the supporting EU is

her objectives. 3 themes were discussed:

- The recognition for a special fair play gesture by Belgian athlete Boumkwo
- A lecture by Elite and Olympic athletes about the risks associated with elite sport.
- The ENGSO Youth Ambassadorship for Integrity in Sport

Sport is more than friendship

Belgian Athlete Jolie Boumkwo was world news when she filled in for her colleague in the 100 meters hurdles on June 24, 2023 in Poland. Boumkwo is Belgian champion hammer hurling. Anne Zagré was unexpectedly injured, and the team risked not being qualified should the team have to give up. With the approval of her coach, Boumkwo was allowed to fill in in a discipline that is not hers. With this, the Belgian team qualified, and the shot putter became world news. IB member Patrick Van Campenhout handed over the award from Panathlon and invited her to join the Panathlon movement.

Sport needs greater care of potential riks

As a 2nd topic, the gymnasts Wannes Vlaeminck and Laura Waem gave an account of their experiences as World Champion and Olympic athlete. Vlaeminck (17 years old) outlined the many challenges for a young gymnast in Acro Gym and specifically the many sacrifices to combine studies with top sport. He won gold at the 2022 world championships. Today he switched the athletics discipline of pole vault.

Laura Waem (26), pharmacist in the Master of Science in Drug Development is a former Olympic gymnast painted a substantiated picture of how sport in general should ensure that young athletes can experience their sport in a safe way. Laura discussed the risk factors she had also personally encountered:

There is often a power imbalance. This means that the coach has power over the athlete, but also over the athlete's parents.

In addition, prioritizing performance and winning over the well-being of the athlete is seen as a major risk factor in sport. In elite sports, performance, success and winning are often the main objectives, regularly at the expense of the athlete's health and well-being. This can lead to competitive pressure, athlete tolerance for abusive behavior by coaches and the fostering of an attitude in underage athletes in which performance is considered more important than their own well-being.

An unbalanced life also makes the elite athlete especially vulnerable. This includes the many sacrifices required, the fact that their life and identity often revolve entirely around their performance, as well as isolation from other interests and social connections with people outside of the sports environment.

Finally, there is the influence of elite sports culture, often focusing on issues such as athlete weight, the high tolerance for physical violence in certain sports (as pain is often seen as "part of the process") and approaching the athlete as a mechanical model to be optimized, rather than as an individual with their own needs and well-being.

Having knowledge of the potential risks within sports is an important first step.

The next essential stage is to implement a stricter integrity framework for sports federations. An integrity framework can include several elements that are indispensable to ensure the practice of sport with integrity:

It is essential to create an independent point where complaints can be reported, with an Integrity Point of Contact that is appointed by sports clubs or sports federations.

Establishing clear codes of conduct and ethics for everyone involved in a sports federation, from athletes to coaches, administrators to volunteers. Federations need to ensure that these codes are strictly adhered to by all stakeholders and that non-compliance should carry consequences to correct the wrongdoing.

Establishing protocols for action. These protocols should provide a clear roadmap to be followed within the sports federation when physical, psychological, or sexual abusive behavior is suspected or identified.

Education and awareness regarding ethics should be an integral part of the integrity framework which applies to athletes, coaches, and other stakeholders.

In-depth screening and continuous evaluation of coaches is crucial, as dealing with athletes is not only about technical aspects, but also about didactic and pedagogical skills.

Moreover, providing adequate support and counselling for victims, including access to medical and psychological care, is also key to recovery and justice.

Sports federations should pay attention to a properly considered exit policy and related aftercare for athletes who must or choose to leave elite sports.

And finally, the cooperation with other organizations, both national and international, is vital to address and prevent abuse in sport.

Laura Waem: in sum, it is not enough to just acknowledge the risks related to practicing elite sports. Sport federations must implement an integrity framework to ensure that their disciplines remain a safe, fair, and ethical environment for all involved.

They should also ensure, that the framework is respected by all involved.

IB member Patrick Van Campenhout congratulated Laura Waem for her career and strong message on ethics in Sport and invited her to join the Panathlon Family.

ENGSO Youth Integrity Ambassadors Project

The third chapter in the EWOS event was the project of the Youth Integrity Ambassadors. Tiago Guilherme, policy officer at ENGSO Youth was very positive about then outcome of the event, quote:

On 26 September 2023, ENGSO and ENGSO Youth joined forces with European Lotteries and Panathlon International, and organized an event under the theme "Sport Integrity as an accelerator for inclusion and involvement in sport", which was held in Brussels, Belgium. The event welcomed world-class athletes, the

Youth Ambassadors of the Youth Integrity Ambassadors Program (YIAP), Panathlon International Board Members, ENGSO, ENGSO Youth, European Week of Sports authorities, EL members and experts from the field of sport.

"Integrity is a crucial aspect, if we want to include and involve more people in sport and push more citizens to be active we need to keep our sport environment clean, safe, fair and value-centered", were the welcoming words of Marie Denitton, ENGSO Office Director and main coordinator of the YIAP project for the Swedish Sport Confederation.

The event also recognized great examples of integrity. Panathlon International awarded Jolien Boumkwo for stepping up for the Belgium team and avoiding their disqualification from the EU championship in Poland.

The session continued with the presentation of the Youth Integrity Ambassadors Program as an example of good practices within the youth and sport field by fostering youth empowerment and promoting a culture of integrity across sport clubs and organizations through a network of young ambassadors across Europe that act as multipliers and agents of change within their local realities.

One of the highlights of the event was the discussion around values and integrity in the sport field, brought up by 2 testimonies of Olympic Gymnast Laura Waem and World Champion Gymnast Wannes Vlaeminck.

The other was, without any doubt, the presentation of YIAP local activities and experiences from the young integrity ambassadors, representing Special Olympics Europe Asia, EUSA and RF Småland.

The ambassadors then took the floor for an interactive session with the audience called "Is it Fair play or not?", promoting discussions about integrity, fair play and values in the sport field based on specific sport cases.

Speaking for the three hosting organizations during the conclusions of the event Alvise Angelini (Senior Policy Officer & Sport Secretary at EL) launched their joint action plan for 2024, to continue fostering "Involvement, Inclusion and Innovation" and continue the work on integrity."

A dinner concluded the fourth edition of the Panathlon EWOS event organized by the Representation of Panathlon International at the EU institutions in Brussels.

The event, organized by Padua Panathlon Club, is one of the initiatives promoted by Panathlon International to raise awareness on fair play and reaffirm the ethical values of Panathlon sport, which has helped to popularize it during its 72 year history.

"With this award, Padua Panathlon International wants to emphasize once again that sport is an

effective tool for mental health and rehabilitation - comments Fiorenzo Zanella, president of Panathlon - so that detainees can regain confidence in themselves, in others and in the public and private institutions".

ASD Polisportiva Pallalpiede was founded with the aim of promoting sport as a means of rehabilitation and social interaction through the shared and international language of football.

Ethics in Portuguese with 60 experts

Ethics Summit 2023 - Ethics and integrity in sport at the centre of discussion

The Panathlon Club of Lisbon organized the "Ética Summit 2023" congress (hereinafter Summit), which was a 100% digital and free of cost, that took place on 8, 9 and 10 September 2023, involving eight Lusophone countries (Angola, Brasil, Cabo Verde, Moçambique, Guiné-Bissau, São Tomé e Princípe, Portugal and Timor-Leste).

Panathlon Club of Lisbon counted with the support of the Panathlon International District of Brazil, making this a truly interesting collaboration between different Panathlon clubs of different continents.

In addition, the Summit also counted with the support of the Federal Confederation of Physical Education of Brazil, the Portuguese Institute of Sport and Youth, the Portuguese Sports Foundation, the National Confederation of Physical Education Teachers' Associations, the Confederation of Coaches of Portugal, the Confederation of Lusophone Coaches and the Faculty of Human Motricity of the University of Lisbon, as well as many other organisations that have voluntarily associated themselves with this project.

The main objectives of the Summit were to promote reflection, debate and the sharing of knowledge on issues associated with ethics and integrity in sport throughout the Portuguese-speaking world. With around 3000 registrations, around 20 sessions and with an approximate of 350 participants per sessions, It was the biggest event of its kind ever held in the sports world involving Portuguese-speaking countries.

Participants of the Summit had the opportunity to attend conferences, round table debates and workshops and also to get involved in working groups of common interest, creating partnerships to build common projects centered on promoting integrity, ethics and fair play in sport.

This Summit, in its second edition, has evolved at all levels compared to last year's edition, firstly because it has more thematic sessions, more partners involved, more sports organisations to support, more registrations and, above all, more diversity in terms of the nationalities of the speakers and fe-

male participation. It also counted with the support of around 30 Ambassadors, which are all renowned athletes or former athletes (Olympic and non-olympic), coaches, sports directors and other sports-related experts. The Summit allowed civil society and sports organisations from all Portuguese-speaking countries to take part. To this end, it had the formal support of around 100 associations, federations and sports organisations, which have committed themselves to the event.

The Summit featured around 60 internationally renowned experts/speakers on the following very pertinent themes in the world of sport, namely:

- (I)) SPORT IN THE 21st CENTURY ONE OF HU-MANITY'S GLOBAL ASSETS:
- (II) YOUTH SPORT (with the sub-themes "protection, safety and rights of children and young athletes" and "role of parents");
- (III) DOPING and ANTIDOPING (with sub-themes on "athletes' rights and duties", "Lusophone strate-

and realities" and "the treatment of doped athletes");

(IV) VIOLENCE IN SPORT (with sub-themes "journalistic coverage of violence in sport", "policies and practices in prevention" and "racism and xenophobia");

(V)MANIPULATION (with the sub-themes "illegal sports betting", "match-fixing and the defense of integrity"). Furthermore, the Summit also had two thematic blocks which had as goal to discuss topics particularly of interest in Africa: "Fraud in the age" and "Governance", for which we had one representant from each portuguese-speaking African country in its roundtable discussion.

Finally, the Summit could not have been done without the approval of the Panathlon Club members, its Board members and President, Mário Almeida, financial support of IPDJ (Portuguese Institute of Sport and Youth), Fundação do Desporto (Portuguese Sports Foundation) and without the collaboration of the Executive Committee of the Summit, which counted with the participation of Filomena Fortes, Teresa Rocha, Pedro Souza, Georgios Hatzidakis, Willian Pimental, José Carvalho, Miguel Fachada and Fábio Figueiras.

Official anthem for Panathlon

A Military march? Romantic Aria? Solemn Classical song? Light reason to all sing in chorus?

This is not the first time this has been suggested: it would be nice to hear an official anthem of the Panathlon International at opening ceremonies and club gatherings.

Several times, in the past, some more or less remote attempts were put forward as "candidates" for an official anthem, however none of these broke through definitively and none secured broad consensus.

Some were made up of military-style drums ideal for accompanying a parade; others were romantic arias favouring an opening of distant horizons; then there were classical songs of solemn character for truly historic occasions; finally, there were also those who proposed songs that celebrated sport in an upbeat form suitable for choral music.

Perhaps few remember those experiments, but those who did put their idea in the mix, it is time to take it out again because the International Council has decided to do things seriously through launching an appeal and a challenge to panathletes who have musical inspiration and strong resolution and who "play" likewise:

Competition for Official PI Anthem -

IC, taking note of what was reported by those present on their experience of representing IP on official occasions, saw it necessary to have a composition that would promote PI to the world also taking note of the proposals of those present and has so decided:

- to involve Panathlon Clubs, so that an official PI anthem may be identified and formalized before the General Assembly on June 2024,
- to instruct the General Secretariat to do so.

A thousand metres of relay race on Fair Play day

The sixth edition of the '1000 km of Fair-Play' took place in September.

This year, as the association celebrated 20 years of Fair-Play activism, the concept evolved to count as many kilometres as possible to highlight the positive values of sport in all its diversity.

As a result, more than 100 Fair-Play awareness relays have been established. Each member and neighbouring institutions of Panathlon Wallonie-Brussels devised their own '1000 km of Fair-Play' on their own territory or within their own organisation to reach a total of over 88,740 km run for Fair-Play by 13,855 runners.

The final stage of the Fair-Play 10,000 km 2023 took place in Watermael-Boitsfort in October. It was a wonderful way to end the operation and to symbolically celebrate the 20th anniversary of Panathlon Wallonie-Brussels, where the association has had its offices since 2003.

The ceremony of World Fair Play Day 2023 took place on Thursday, 7 September at Brussels City Hall. This fourth edition was marked by the exceptional presence of Berit Reiss-Andersen, president of the Norwegian Nobel Peace Prize Committee, who was presented with the 1st 'Sport for Peace Prize' of the European Fair Play Movement awarded to the Norwegian Nobel Committee.

Pina Marino has left us

Catania Panathlon Club is mourning the loss of Professor Pina Marino, married to Ignazio Russo, who is sadly no longer with us.

An unbridgeable loss both to her family and to athletics both nationally and in Catania.

To eulogise about her is a difficult task - whatever is written would not do her justice in terms of the things she did and achieved.

A physical education teacher, at school first and then later at university, she taught the science of exercise. First, as a young athlete, with Libertas Ciclope of Catania, excelling in running, and then as a coach, churning out champions who achieved great results at national level, she took Libertas Katana's colours to yet higher and higher levels; the club was founded by her husband Professor Ignazio Russo - regional Fidal councilor from 1984 to 1992 and national councillor afterwards from 1992 to 2000. She was the first woman in Italy to receive the Coni Gold Star and the first to have been appointed national coach in various specialties as well as receiving the Oak Award of Merit at three levels. These are among the most prestigious honours within the Federation of Athletics. She was a point of reference for thousands of young Catanese citizens as well as her pupils and athletes. Of her 87 years in this world more than 60 of them were dedicated to athletics.

At her funeral, in addition to relatives and friends in attendance for a last farewell, there were also several sports authorities from the island, Regional President, Enzo Falzone, fellow teachers, former athletes and, last but not least, our past Governor of the Area Roberto Pregadio.

The President, Members and Board of Directors of Catania Panathlon Club, are saddened by this serious loss, share in the pain of her husband, our Past President, and for the children Uccio, Alessia and Danilo, for their unbridgeable loss.

Bernadette Graf receives the Daniel Swarovski Panathlon 2023 Award

During a wonderful ceremony, Innsbruck Panathlon Club awarded one of Austria's best judokas - who has established themselves above all within international tatami - with the Panathlon Trophy in memory of KR Daniel Swarovski. Bernadette Graf, born in Innsbruck, is a former 5th place Olympian as well as a being serial medal winner. However, she was not only honoured for her excellent sporting achievements, but for her personal virtues which are very much in keeping with the values of the Panathletic Movement. The first highlight of the evening was the award given to Bernadette Graf, which was then followed by two discussions with senior sports officials on the theme of: "Sport - Yes! But for who and how?" The debate focused on volleyball, swimming, figure skating, school sports and judo.

At BFI-Innsbruck Festival Hall, over 70 guests and sponsors accepted Innsbruck Panathlon Club's invitation. Club President Dr. Winfried Sponring said in his welcome speech: "We at Innsbruck Panathlon Club are impressed by Bernadette Graf's mentality: "It's OK to fall, however don't stay down too long". The prestigious Panathlon Trophy, in memory of KR Daniel Swarovski, was not only awarded on account of her extraordinary sporting achievements. "High values, courage, respect, team spirit and fair play also characterize this year's Panathlon winner," said President Sponring. Bernadette Graf continues to do justice to the list of outstanding Tyrol sportswomen who have already won this award: Kate Alen, Heidi Steinacher-Koch, Nici Pederzolli, Elisabeth Osl, Angelika and Doris Neuner, Christine Wolf, Barbara Schett, Nici Hosp and Angela Eiter. The list of male award-winners extends from Olympic champion Stephan Eberharter to world-famous transplant surgeon, Prof. Raimund Margreiter.

For Bernadette Graf's mentor, President of Austrian Judo, Martin Scherwitzl, who gave a speech of praise, Bernadette Graf is a role model: discipline and iron will following defeats - due to injuries - on the one hand, team spirit and one world of values on the other, go hand in hand with the Panathlon Movement. Moreover, he said, Bernadette is a sportswoman who possesses an immensely human character. And even after the end of her career, Bernadette Graf continues to be involved in the events of Innsbruck Judo Centre. The Panathlon winner, however, is also distinguished by the fact that, at the end of her career, she chose to become a policewoman in Innsbruck.

The fact that the current sports scene in Tyrol can boast of both sportswomen and sportsmen's success, is extremely satisfying. However, there are also less welcome developments which could lead to weakning within sport, specifically within Tyrol, and these were illustrated during the discussion "Sport - Yes! But for

who and how?" held in the second part of the event. Prof. Günther Mitterbauer, Innsbruck Panathlon Club Vice President, outlined the problems together with senior officials. Unanimous thinking: there is a lack of adequate infrastructure. It is true politics develops general plans, however these are never implemented. In this way structural deficits appear and disadvantages arise for Tyrolean society as a whole, illustrated with some examples raised during the discussion. Volleyball absolutely needs a multifunction centre to provide training and exercise units for both the competitive and the youth teams. Hall's artistic skaters, male and female, must travel nearly 100 km to find the right training conditions. The situation in swimming clubs in Tyrol is also precarious - water sports areas are too small and in insufficient number in Tyrol causing training congestion especially during the winter months. "Something needs to be done urgently". Not only for young sportsmen and sportswomen, but also for those responsible for their development, such as Much Falkner (TI volleyball), Martin Scherwitzl (judo), Stefan Opatril (swimming) or Ulrike Scoficz (figure skating), who are all agreed on this. "The sports pyramid is no longer fit for purpose: elite sport that ranks at the top of advertising revenue still receives funding leaving the wider base of clubs engaged in youth and mass sport to make up the insignificant rest", summarised Prof.

Günther Mitterbauer called for a change of mentality: super-athletes and 'Star-Ensembles' should not receive resources from the cauldrons of sports funding as they are, in essence, "commercial enterprises". Sporting resources should instead be reserved for mass and youth sport.

Three women awarded for setting an example in sport World champion, referee and manager

The Italian Officials of Armed Forces Club (Circolo Ufficiali Forze Armate d'Italia) hosted its 24th edition of the award Women's Sport Award. It was organized by the Panathlon International Club of Rome and sponsored by Roma Capitale and CONI Lazio with contributions from BPM Bank.

Receiving the prestigious award (Gloria, a bronze casting of Pierpaolo and Piergiorgio Ermini) were: 24-yearold Elena Micheli from Rome, reigning world champion of Modern Pentathlon both in individual and team events who has already qualified for Paris Olympics 2024; Air Forces lieutenant, Silvia Marziali, first referee of women's 1st Division basketball after Antonella Fabretti's debut 33 years ago; and then also international, and a pioneer of women's management, Stefania Cardenia, Regional Director of Special Olympics Team Lazio. 
Due to her participation in a race in Australia, Lasso could not be present to receive the award. Instead, fellow judoka, Francisco Balanta, was honoured to receive the five-circle trophy from Panathlon Chile past president, Eduardo Gurovich, and Chilean Olympic Committee head, Miguel Angel Mujica.

The ceremony was held at the Parque Estadio Nacional's Main Press Centre and was attended by prominent figures including: Neven Ilic, President of Panam Sports; Chilean Minister of Sport, Jaime Pizarro; Executive Director of Santiago 2023, Harold Mayne-Nicholls; and, even the official mascot, Fiu.

The history of the Fair Play award is linked to a touching gesture that took place during the Games. On 28 October, Erika Lasso faced her Dominican opponent, Estefania Soriano. After her victory, the Colombian athlete showed an extraordinary act of solidarity: realising that Soriano was injured, Lasso carried her on her shoulder so that she could receive the necessary medical care.

This gesture moved the press and the public and merited the Fair Play award of the Games.

The Santiago 2023 Pan American Games were not only a stage for an exceptional competition, but also a place where the principles of sportsmanship and camaraderie between athletes and nations of the continent were celebrated.



Swordswoman choses not to strike injured opponent

"Valentino Galeotti" Fair Play Awards 2023 presented to Emilia Rossatti, Riccardo Schiavina, Alfredo Corallini and Vanni Falchetti

After assessing reports received through a public notice special commission, established by Panathlon Club Ferrara, chose recipients of the "Valentino Galeotti" Fair Play Awards 2023 – now the fifth edition of the competition since its launch which was dedicated to the memory of the club's Past President.

The Awards have dual significance as they are also the basis for candidacy to the World Fair Play Awards - prestigious awards presented annually by International Fair Play Committee (www.fairplay-international.org). Let's set out in detail who won what in the various categories:

The **award for "THE DEED"** this year was almost a foregone conclusion given the extraordinary demonstration of Fair Play from swordswoman **Emilia Rossatti** from Ferrara who, in April, during the finals of the under 23s Italian Championships in fencing, 17 seconds before the end, decided not to take advantage of her injured opponent, Roman Gaia Traditi, and instead let the clock run down not overturning the result which was open and saw her on the receiving end at that point in the match. A "running down of the clock" matched by the fullness of heart of the Estense and nobility of her sword. A nobility that the commission believed was the result of an exemplary track record of sporting conduct with coach Riccardo Schiavina who helped her take the decision by indicating with a glance.

A surprise then to reward them in tandem in order reiterating the importance and educational imprint sport can offer because "The choice of a young person depends on their inclination, but also on the luck of meeting a great teacher." [Rita Levi-Montalcini].

The "CAREER" category award went to Alfredo Corallini, already winner of the 2017 Diamond Sports Award, and esteemed university professor and "heart and soul" of U.S.D. ACLI San Luca/San Giorgio – a sports club that this year celebrates its sixty years anniversary - and that Corallini has presided over since 1973 and which is responsible, among other things, for the inauguration of the sports facility in Via del Campo.



Within the "PROMOTION" category was a name linked, perhaps indirectly, to sport nevertheless it was within sport and in promoting fair play that they found a way to perpetuate the Memory becoming a promoter of a fantastic and inclusive paralympic sports event - "Sport Is Live/Life" – and installing an inclusive playground within an open-air sports facility, the Oasis of Canoeing Club Ferrara, as well as building and developing hospitals and schools through Onlus Afrika Twende. These are some of the initiatives carried out by Vanni Falchetti and the whole family to honor the memory of his son Fabio, by offering life, enthusiasm and socialising.

The commission has decided to add *a prize for a life dedicated to Fair Play* to the other traditional categories, to honour the spirit that has always embodied the activity of *Natalino Patria*, Man of Sport and Football, deeply connected to SPAL and to the whole sports world of Ferrara, and lately playing the role of secretary of the National Association of Olympic Athletes and the Azzuri in Italy, dedicating the same levels of energy, vital force and selflessness to each role he has taken on.

"Pallalpiede...but leather

American writer John Steinbeck, winner of the 1962 Nobel Prize for Literature, points out that a prisoner must never think about the final moment of liberation otherwise he risks banging his head against a wall instead he must focus on today, on tomorrow, beyond the football match to be played at the weekend.

The latter option has been decidedly put into action in Padua where for about 10 years a multi-sports club made up of inmates from "Due Palazzi" prison has been running. Named "Pallalpiede" they play in the Third Division football league FIGC bringing together more than 30 inmates made up of 10 different nationalities.

It embodies an important example of multiculturality and represents a unique experience in Italy with the purpose of using sport to revive mental health and joie du vivre, rehabilitating and reintegrating the young and not so young - thereby helping them regain their confidence in themselves, in others and in the institutions, fully reintegrating them into society once they have served their sentences as a result of the mistakes they have committed even when these are very serious.

In this case, social inclusion is a real fact of life, to be admired for its substance, implemented through sport that is not only physical activity but also develops a sense of morality because rules must be followed as well as those written in one's conscience.

Under the banner of Fair-Play etymologically combines the idea of justice, solidarity and loyalty (fairness) with the idea of play, gestural and spiritual beauty and fun (playfulness). As taught by the Panathlon - international movement officially recognized by IOC, CONI and CIP for promoting sport culture and ethics - who, as part of the European Week of Sport, want to attribute great merit to Pallalpiede for having dominated the Discipline Cup for years as well as for their valid competitive results in the field. For the latter, some joker may highlight that Pallalpiede has the disadvantage of always having to play in ten without the "free..."

Long live Pallalpiede, another jewel in the crown for Padua, European city of sport!






Spirit and Ideals

The Foundation was established in memory of Domenico Chiesa, on the initiative of his heirs Antonio, Italo and Maria. In 1951, Domenico Chiesa had been not just a promoter of the first Panathlon Club but had also drawn up its draftstatute and, in 1960, he was one of the founders of Panathlon International. Although not technically binding for his heirs, Chiesa had express, in life, the desire to allocate a share of his assets to the regular assignment of prizes for artistic works inspired by sport, as well as for cultural initiatives and publications sharing the same objectives as Panathlon International.

In the constitution of the Foundation, alongside the substantial contribution of Chiesa's heirs, one should also remember the generous input of the entire panathletic movement through its numerous clubs and the personal intervention of many panathletes, that managed to offer the Foundation the necessary conditions to make its debut in the world of visual arts in a prestigious and striking way: the establishment of an award implemented in association with one of the leading organizations in the world, La Biennale di Venezia

Domenico Chiesa Award

On 24 September 2004, the Board of Panathlon International, considering the need to increase the capital of the Foundation and to honour the memory of one of Panathlon's founding members, first benefactor and inspiration for the same, established the "Domenico Chiesa Award" to be assigned, on the proposal of the individual clubs and on the basis of specific regulations, to one or more panathletes or non-member personalities who have lived the panathletic spirit.
